 Autumn 1- ALL ABOUT ME Sequencing of a school day Life history – parents, grandparents – making sense of they own life story and family's history Sequencing events from own life story. Talk about how they have changed in their life. Look at photos of our family and talk about who is in them. Look at themselves, create portraits, look at things that are the same and things that are different about themselves and their friends. Talk about things they have done and focus on these things being on the past. Autumn 2 – TOYS/JUDAISM/CHRISTMAS Look at pictures and physical toys - list the toys we like playing with. Look at toys they played with as a baby and how they have changed. Christmas story – then and now ASSESSMENT CHECKPOINTS (knowledge / skills) Look and listen for pupils to: Talk about the events of a school day, using appropriate vocabulary Seeks out others to shares experiences and recent events e.g. within the last few days Talk about who is in my family and know that not all families are the same. Begins to make sense of their own life-story and family's history e.g. knowing Grandma is Mummy's Mum. Know that my Grandparents and my parents are older than me but once they were little like meTalk about what toys babies play with.
