Dear Parents/Carers,

Our remote home learning plan

As you may be aware, schools are required to have a remote home learning plan in place so that any child who cannot attend school because of COVID-19 does not miss out on their learning.

This letter explains our plans for remote learning for children who have to self-isolate, or where local or national restrictions mean that children need to stay at home. The full detail of our remote learning offer is available in our Remote Learning Policy (available on the school website).

Our remote learning plan has been made with our pupils and their families in mind. We believe that this strategy will work best for the children at our school. We aim to provide a language-rich and reading-rich curriculum, which is knowledge-based, ambitious and purposeful in its content for all learners. It is important that all pupils progress well in the basic skills of reading, writing, grammar and number so that all may access a full curriculum.

What will be offered?

The way in which Remote Home Learning is delivered and the activities set will depend on various scenarios that may occur:

- SCENARIO 1: Individual pupil(s) required to self-isolate in line with governmental Covid-19 advice
- SCENARIO 2: Class 'bubble' isolation or school closure

In both scenarios, schools are required to provide remote home learning which should reflect a normal school day and cover the different areas of the school curriculum across the school week.

What will pupils need at home?

Learning resources and lessons will be available online. Children will need a device that can access the internet such as a laptop, desktop computer, or tablet. A smartphone would also be adequate to access remote home learning materials.

Of course, we are aware that some families may not have devices that they can use at home. In these circumstances, we have a number of school-issue laptops which can be loaned to pupils.

Where pupils do not have suitable online access, we will provide printed resources. In these circumstances, parents/carers will need to arrange for someone who is not isolating, to collect paper materials, via the school office. Please ring the office prior to coming to school, and we will present the home learning materials at the school gate.

Children will be provided with a remote home learning exercise book to be used to record written tasks. This book will also contain a list of pupil log-ins for online resources.

What will we expect from your child?

We understand that each family's circumstances and their access to learning material for their children will differ, and the responsibility to provide educational support at home can be difficult for families. It is, however, important that pupils remain engaged in education, even when they are not attending the school site.

There will be an expectation that all children will access and submit work.

Where pupils are not engaging with the learning, we will use the following strategies to provide additional support:

- Phone call home
- Increased feedback from class teachers

What can parents/carers do to help?
